



Who

All persons requiring access to the Pentagon, and Mark Center; CAC and PIV card holders, Concessionaires, Visitors and Contractors will be required to enroll in the Privilege Management Program. Once enrolled, your CAC, PIV or alternative card will be used for physical access.

What

The Privilege Management Program, in line with the requirements of Homeland Security Presidential Directive 12 will now enable the electronic capabilities of the CAC.

When

PMP enrollment will be in a phased approach: Mark Center and Pentagon personnel will be the first groups to enroll and subsequent enrollments will be of other NCR tenants.

Additionally, while enrollment in the PMP is underway, the Pentagon access control system will be undergoing planned upgrades. To schedule your enrollment, please visit www.pfpa.mil.

Where

The initial phase of the PMP implementation will focus on Mark Center and Pentagon access control. Later phases will include parking, visitor control and other National Capital Region locations.

Why

The PMP is a key element of a Federal Government mandate called Homeland Security Presidential Directive 12, or HSPD-12. This mandate calls for a Government wide identification standard for people gaining access to federal buildings and information systems using a vetted identification credential.

How

Once enrolled in the PMP, the CAC will be used for both building access and your computer workstation.

The PMP will automate processes and improve security through the use of the electronic capabilities of the CAC and multimodal biometrics.

Future Phases

Visitors will either be issued an electronic ID badge or have the ability to enroll their CAC, or other Federal agency smart card (PIV) for access. All visitors will be electronically sponsored and validated by the PMP.

Non CAC eligible persons requiring daily access (Concessionaires and Vendors) will enroll in the PMP to receive the new Alternative Card. This card will allow physical access, but not to DOD Computers.

Parking and door access requests will be automated through the use of digital signatures and secure online web portals.

PFPA will start the phased transition from the building pass to the CAC and continue access control upgrades, so stay tuned for further updates. Also, PFPA has begun an education and awareness campaign that will assist with notifying building occupants. In the mean time, continue to swipe your existing building pass through the access control readers, as you always have!
